Multiple Choice Questions:

1 = **b**. A service dog, as defined by ADA law, is a dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities

2 = **a**. Service/Assistance Dogs are the only dogs that have public access rights when with their handler

3 = **c**. The only two questions that can be asked of someone with a service dog are (1) Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability? And (2) What work or task has the dog been trained to perform?

True or False Questions:

4a = **False**. ADA law does NOT require service dogs to have a vest on while in public

4b = **True**. ADA law states that a service dog can be excused from a public space if the dog is not under control, not housebroken, or otherwise disrupting the flow of business

4c = **False**. Allergies and fear of dogs are NOT valid reasons to excuse a service dog from a public space
